

Armand Sabourin

After high school, where Armand captained the football and baseball teams, he attended Dean Academy on a football scholarship. There, he also captained both the football and baseball teams.

He earned a football scholarship to the University of Massachusetts, Amherst, where he played both football and baseball, and captained the baseball team. In 1960, he was voted Athlete of the Year. He graduated in 1960 with a Bachelor of Science in Mathematics.

His two years in the Army were spent working for NASA on the Space Program in Huntsville, Alabama, and playing football for the base team.

He left the Army to initiate a football program at Clearwater, Florida, Central Catholic High School. There, he coached football and taught math for five years, until returning to Massachusetts. For his remaining 33 years in the profession, he coached football and baseball and taught math at Bedford High School. His teams won 5 Dual County League championships in football, and 2 DCL championships in baseball.

Armand was a member of the Mass. Football Coaches Association Executive Board for 30 years, and President of the Association in 1984. His acknowledgments include
